



Acacia acinacea

Gold Dust Wattle

Height:	0.5m - 2.5m
Width:	2m - 4m
Habit:	Small to medium multi-stemmed open spreading shrub, denser in cultivation.
Foliage:	Small rounded or oblong phyllodes (leaves) to 1cm long, sometimes larger.
Flowers:	Abundant bright yellow balls along arching branches from August to November.
Requirements:	Adaptable, well drained soils. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	The Gold Dust Wattle is hardy, fast growing, frost and drought tolerant. Tolerates a wide variety of soils and conditions. Ornamental, good low screening plant. Annual pruning is beneficial.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.

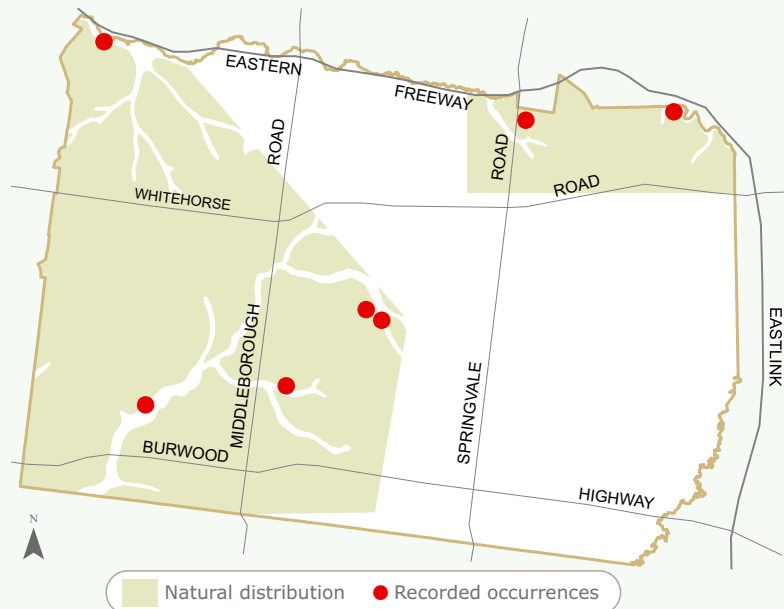
