



Acacia dealbata

Silver Wattle

Height:	6m - 30m
Width:	5m - 10m
Habit:	A fast-growing open tree.
Foliage:	Fine fern-like bluish-green foliage.
Flowers:	Profuse lemon ball flowers from July to October.
Requirements:	Adaptable to a wide range of sites but prefers deep moist soil. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	The Silver Wattle is a hardy easily grown tree ideal for parks and larger gardens and for use as windbreaks or erosion control.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.

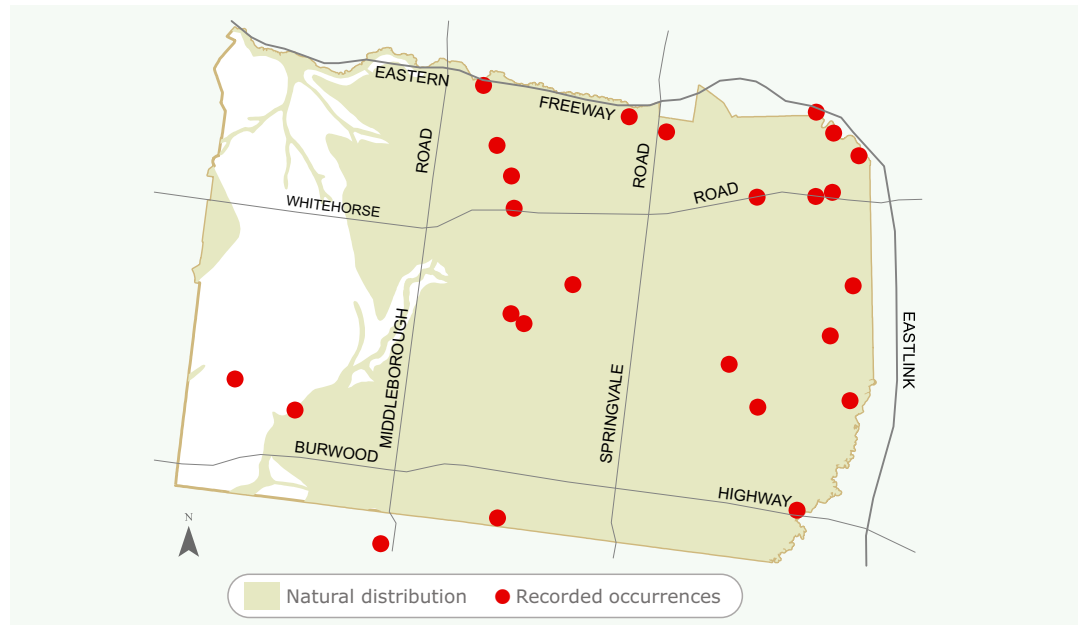
