



Acacia implexa

Lightwood or Hickory Wattle

Height:	5m - 15m
Width:	4m - 7m
Habit:	A fast-growing upright small tree.
Foliage:	Sickle shaped phyllodes (leaves) to 20cm x 20cm.
Flowers:	Flowers in perfumed cream balls December to March.
Requirements:	Tolerates both wet and dry, well drained clay soil. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	An attractive long-lived screen or shade tree. Useful for erosion control and bank planting. Hardy and adaptable.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.

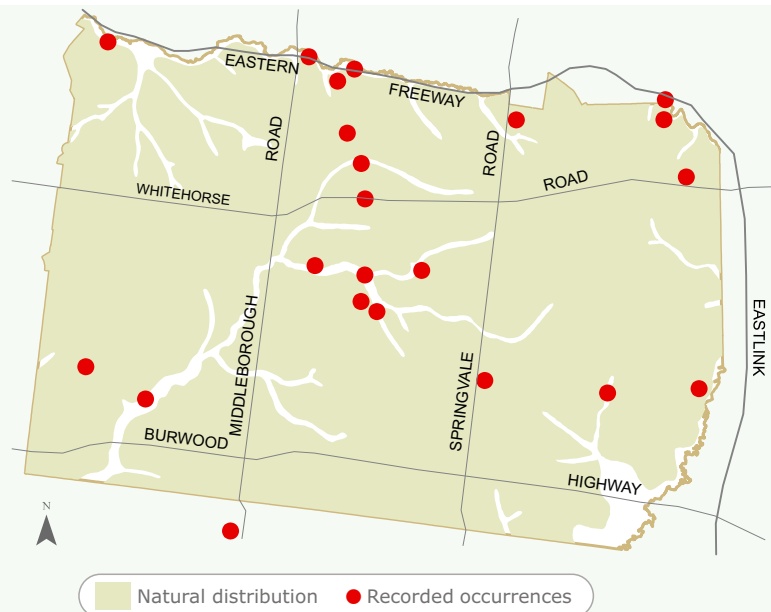
