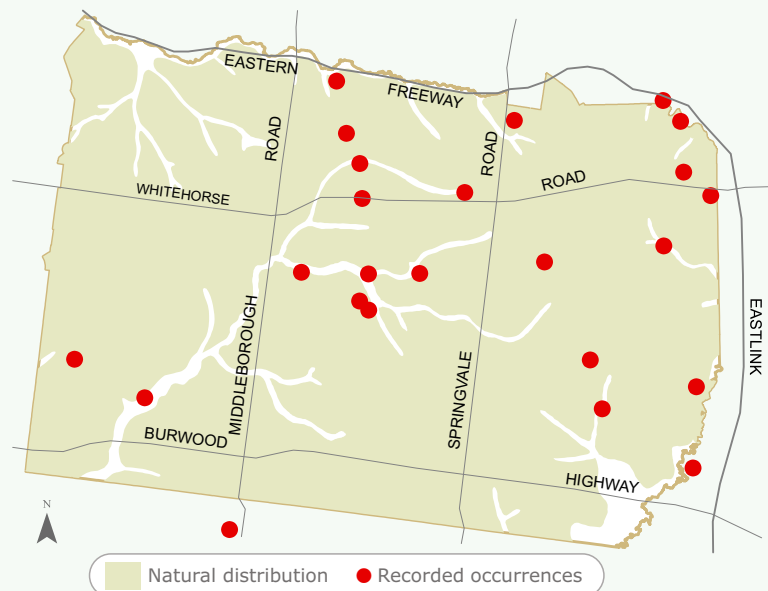
Golden Wattle

| Height: | 3m - 10m |
| Width: | 2m - 5m |
| Habit: | A fast-growing erect or spreading small tree. |
| Foliage: | Bright green, broad curved phyllodes (leaves) to 20cm x 1-5cm wide. |
| Flowers: | Perfumed golden balls flowering profusely in July to October. |
| Requirements: | Well drained soil, tolerating a range of sites. Full or partial sun. |
| Cultivation & uses: | An ornamental tree popular in cultivation. Pruning while young encourages denser habit. Good screening and windbreak tree and is useful for erosion control. Drought resistant. The Golden Wattle is Australia's national floral emblem. |

Local Distribution:

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.
