



# *Allocasuarina littoralis*

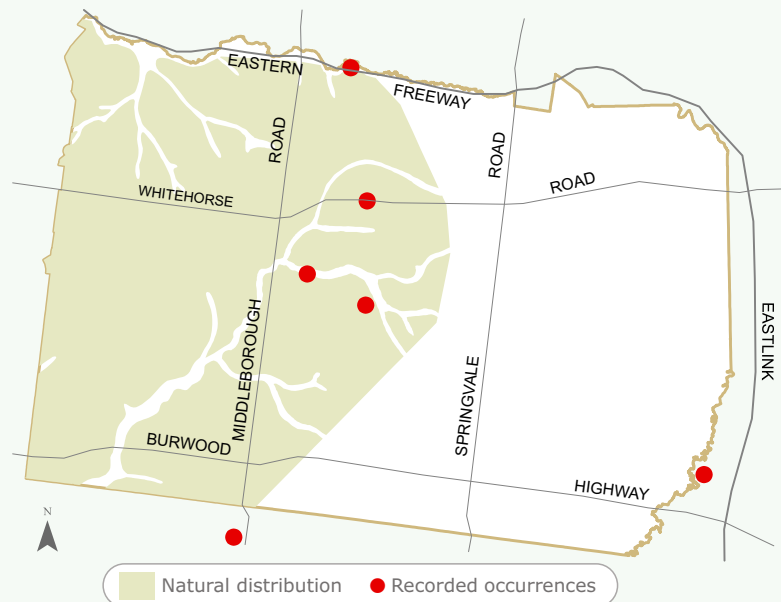
## Black She-oak

<b>Height:</b>	4m - 8m
<b>Width:</b>	2m - 5m
<b>Habit:</b>	A fast-growing upright small tree.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Fine bright green branchlets.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Flowering March to June. Female flowers reddish to crimson, male flowers dark brown held on spikes. Fruits are small woody cones.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Well drained soils. Tolerates a range of soils types. Full or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	Suitable for use as a windbreak. Drought tolerant. The bark on old trees is dark and deeply furrowed.

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.
