



Alternanthera denticulata

Lesser Joyweed

Height:	15cm - 30cm
Width:	50cm
Habit:	Low straggling perennial herb.
Foliage:	Narrow to oblong leaves from 2cm - 10cm long.
Flowers:	Short small-roundish spikes of silvery-white-pinkish flowers. Flowers most of the year.
Requirements:	Moist soils. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Useful when planted in boggy areas, beside small ponds and other wet areas. Prune after flowering to encourage a bushy growth.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is rare.

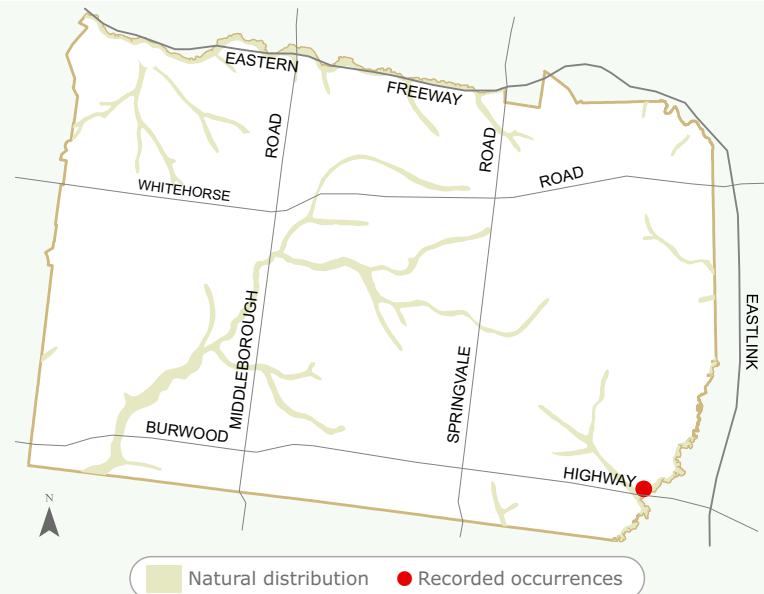
