



Arthropodium milleflorum

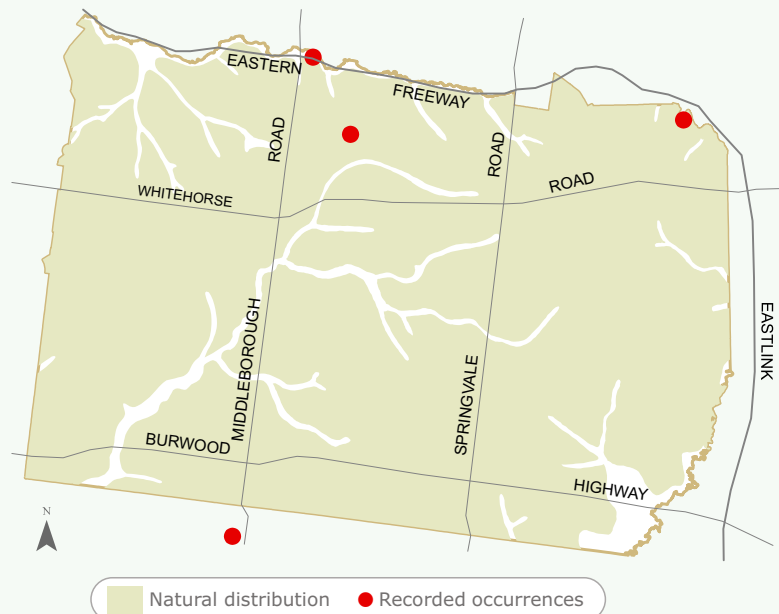
Pale Vanilla Lily

Height:	0.3m - 1m
Width:	30cm
Habit:	Grass-like tufted perennial herb.
Foliage:	Slightly fleshy dark green narrow leaves to 30cm x 10-30mm.
Flowers:	Pale pink, mauve or white vanilla scented flowers in clusters of 2 or 3 on branched slender stems to 1m tall from September to March.
Requirements:	Moist clay soils. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	An attractive plant, effective in mass plantings. The pale Vanilla Lily dies down to the dormant tuberous rootstock during summer.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is rare.
