



Banksia spinulosa var. *cunninghamii*

Hairpin Banksia

Height:	2m - 4m
Width:	2m - 5m
Habit:	Dense erect or spreading shrub.
Foliage:	Dark green narrow toothed leaves to 10cm long.
Flowers:	Yellow candlespike flowerheads to 20cm long with blackish 'hooked' shaped styles. Flowering from February to July. Seed is retained in the cone.
Requirements:	Prefers moist well drained soils, but will tolerate dryness once established. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	A reliable plant suited for growing under established trees. Light pruning encourages bushiness for an attractive screen. Bird attracting.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.

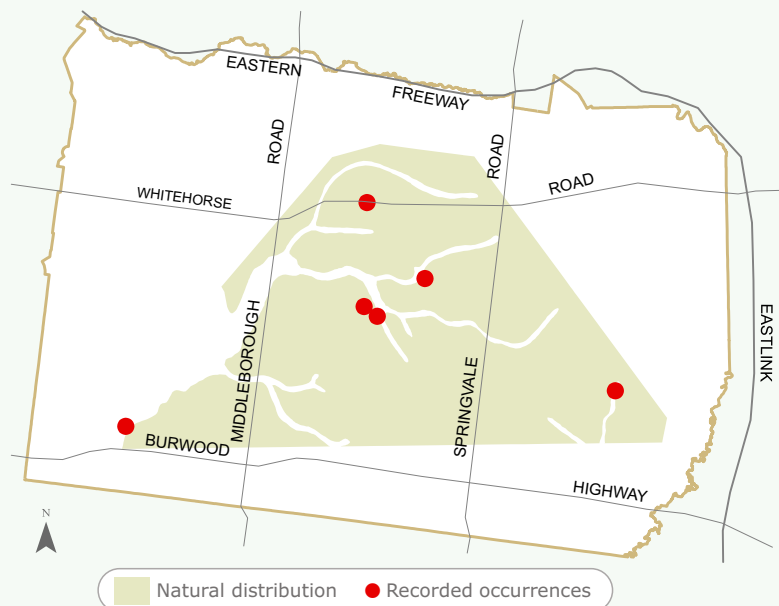
