



Carex fascicularis

Tassel Sedge

Height:	0.5m - 1m
Width:	50cm - 75cm
Habit:	Coarse tufted plant, spreading from short underground stems.
Foliage:	Bright green leaves, almost as long as stems, 8mm wide.
Flowers:	Whitish to pale brown drooping flowerheads on long stems forming cylindrical spikes 30-60cm long, borne near the end of the stem. Flowering October to April.
Requirements:	Moist to wet soils, tolerating inundation. Partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Common sedge found along watercourses and near swamps. An attractive grass for around water, such as ponds, pools and wetlands. Useful for erosion control.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.

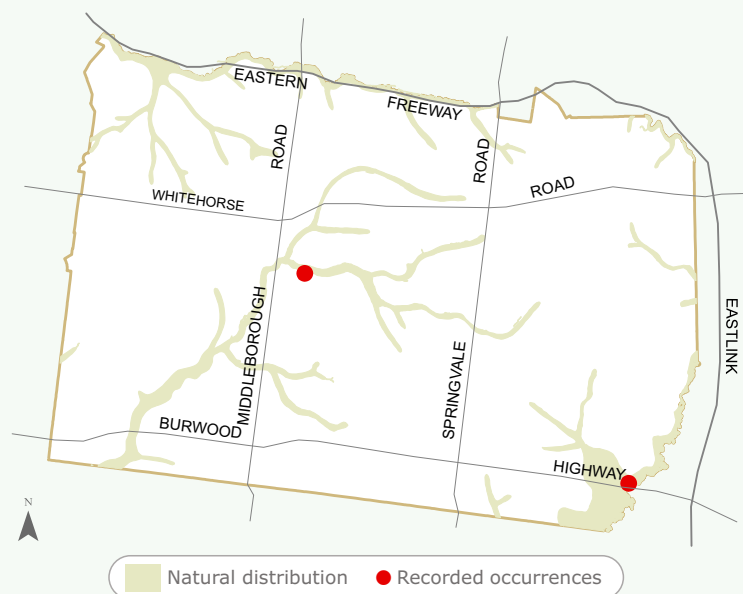
