



Cassinia arcuata

Drooping Cassinia, Chinese Shrub

Height:	1m - 4m
Width:	1m - 2m
Habit:	Open erect to weeping rounded shrub.
Foliage:	Spicy aromatic, small narrow drooping shiny leaves to 1cm long.
Flowers:	Long, narrow, drooping clusters of shiny pale brown flowerheads hanging from branches. Flowers from November to February.
Requirements:	Dry, well drained soils. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Graceful pioneer plant, very easy to grow. Useful for dry, hard to grow areas. Can be planted beneath established trees. Remove old flowerheads to promote new flowers and dense growth. Readily colonises disturbed soils.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is high.

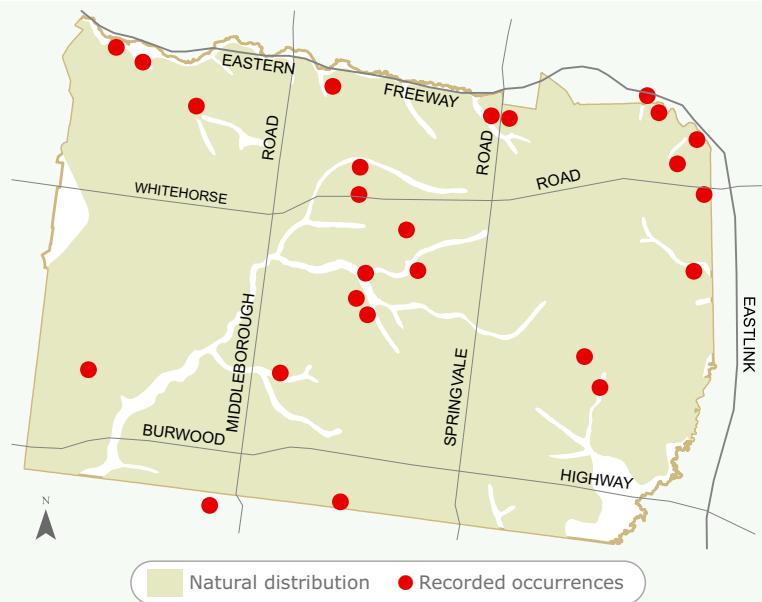
