



Centella cordifolia

Swamp Pennywort

Height:	Prostrate
Width:	1m - 2m
Habit:	Fast-growing creeping perennial herb.
Foliage:	Round, heart-shaped light green leaves to 4cm x 5cm along trailing stems.
Flowers:	White to pink tiny flowers, grouped on stems to 4cm long. Flowers from August to January.
Requirements:	Moist to wet soils. Tolerant of inundation. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	A vigorous groundcover that may become invasive in ideal situations. Useful when planted around pools or boggy areas. Matting plant, useful for bank stabilisation.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.

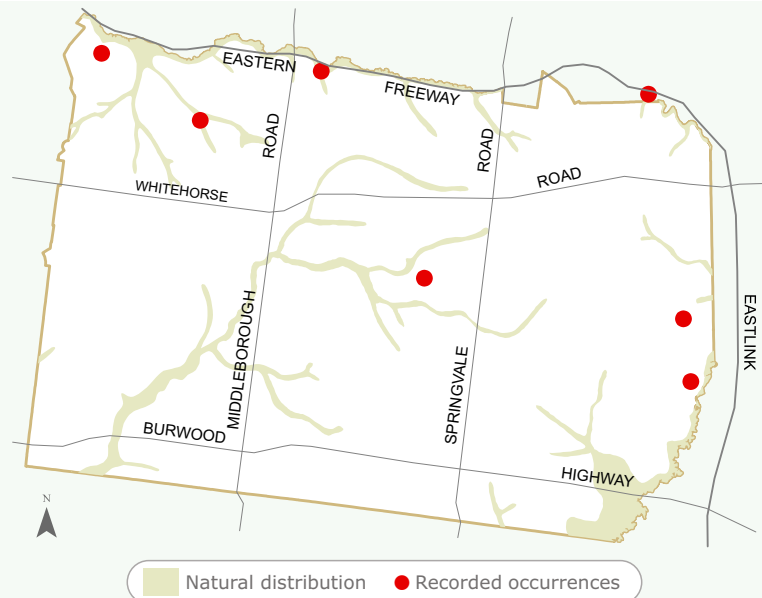
