



Correa glabra

Rock or Smooth Correa

Height:	1m - 2m
Width:	1m - 3m
Habit:	Variable dense upright to spreading shrub.
Foliage:	Dark green oblong leaves, usually with wavy edges, to 4cm long.
Flowers:	Pale green bells, flowers peak in May to August, with odd flowers throughout the year.
Requirements:	Well drained soils. Shade, full or partial sun, though prefers light shade.
Cultivation & uses:	An attractive, hardy and easily grown shrub that is lime and drought tolerant. Ideal as a low screen or hedging plant and can be established underneath canopies of existing trees. Attractive to birds.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is rare.

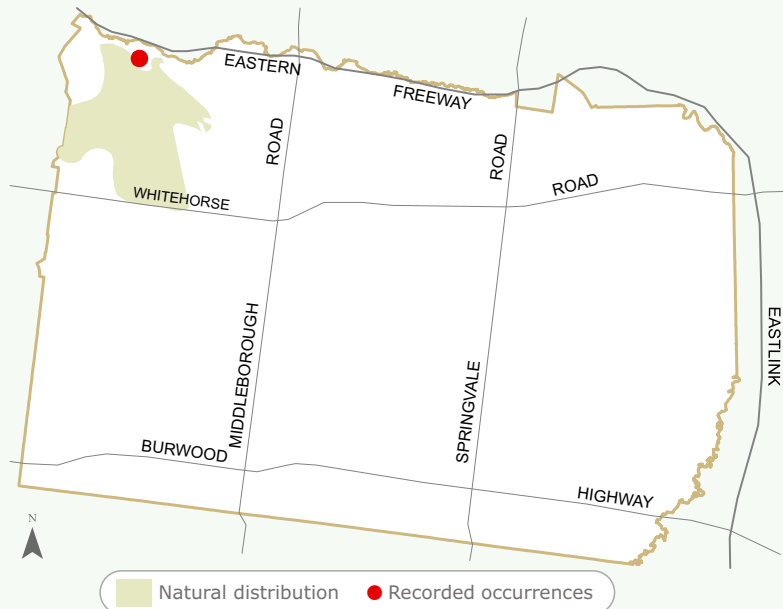
