



Correa reflexa

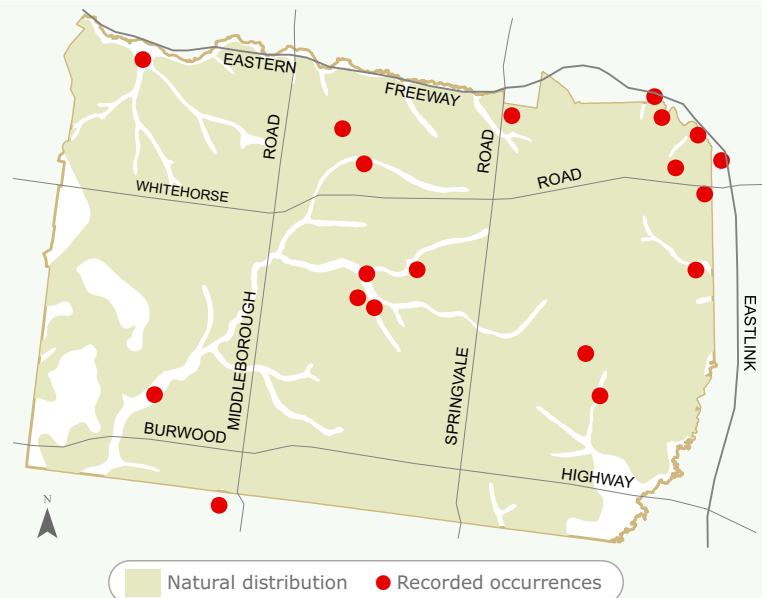
Native Fuchsia, Common Correa

Height:	0.3m - 2m
Width:	1m - 2m
Habit:	Variable, open upright to spreading shrub.
Foliage:	Dull green oblong leaves to 5cm long.
Flowers:	Long pendulous light green tubular flowers with stamens tipped with large yellow anthers. Flowers from March to September.
Requirements:	Well drained soils. Shade, full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	A hardy, attractive garden plant excellent for dry shady areas and for establishing beneath trees. Prune to maintain its bushy shape. Attractive for nectar seeking birds.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.
