



Daviesia latifolia

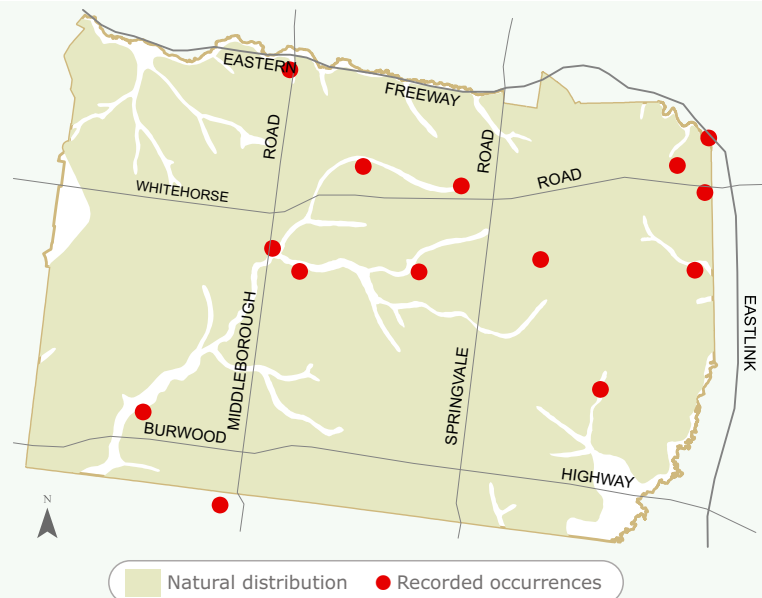
Hop Bitter-pea

Height:	1m - 3m
Width:	1m - 2m
Habit:	Open to dense, multi-stemmed medium shrub with angular branches.
Foliage:	Dull green elliptic to oval-shaped leathery leaves to 10cm long.
Flowers:	Dense clusters of small fragrant yellow and brown pea flowers. Flowering from September to December.
Requirements:	Well drained, adaptable to most soils. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Useful as an informal hedge or screening plant and effective in massed plantings. Can be pruned to desired shape. Frost tolerant.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.
