



Daviesia leptophylla

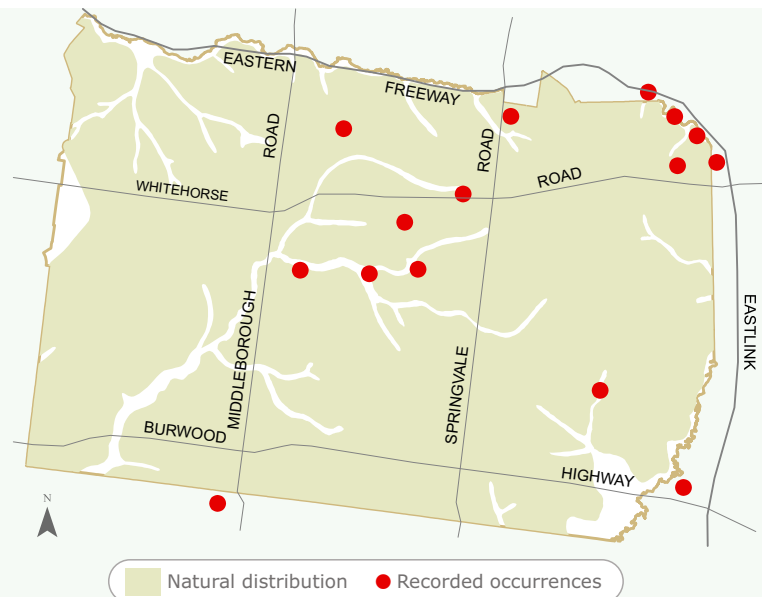
Narrow-leaf Bitter Pea, Slender Bitter Pea

Height:	1m - 2m
Width:	1m - 2m
Habit:	Broom-like open erect shrub with angular branchlets.
Foliage:	Stiff, narrow dull green leaves to 10cm long.
Flowers:	Dense clusters of small yellow and red pea flowers. Flowering from September to January.
Requirements:	Well drained soils. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Very decorative providing interesting foliage and attractive flowers. Planting in swarms to form dense thickets is very effective and provides a lower-level windbreak. May be planted beneath existing trees.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.
