



# *Dichondra repens*

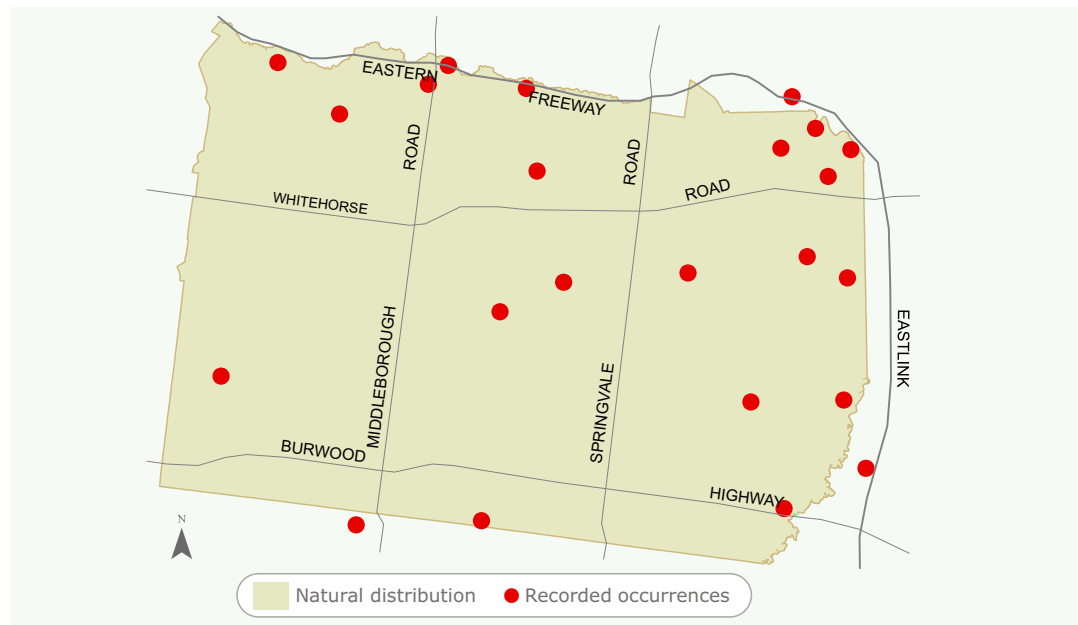
## Kidney Weed

<b>Height:</b>	Prostrate
<b>Width:</b>	Up to 2m
<b>Habit:</b>	Dense creeping perennial spreading herb.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Bright green kidney-shaped leaves to 4cm long.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Small inconspicuous greenish flowers from September to December.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Adaptable, prefers well drained soils. Keep moist in dry weather. Shade or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	A hardy, attractive creeping groundcover used to form a dense mat in moist shady areas. May be used as a lawn substitute for under trees or where foot traffic is light. Works well between pavers of stepping stones and around pond gardens. Useful for filling spaces to inhibit weeds. Frost tolerant.

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is high.
