



Enchylaena tomentosa

Barrier Saltbush, Ruby Saltbush

Height:	Prostrate - 1m
Width:	0.5m - 1m
Habit:	Low spreading or upright woody shrub.
Foliage:	Bluish-green to dark green semi-succulent leaves narrowly cylindrical or linear leaves to 2cm long, covered with fine white hairs giving the plant a greyish appearance.
Flowers:	Insignificant greenish flowers in Spring and early Summer, followed by succulent green berries which change to yellow or red.
Requirements:	Adaptable, tolerating poor soils, dryness and some salinity. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	An attractive hardy plant useful for undershrub plantings. The variation in fruit colour persists over long periods giving an interesting feature in the garden. Pruning is beneficial. Frost tolerant.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is rare.

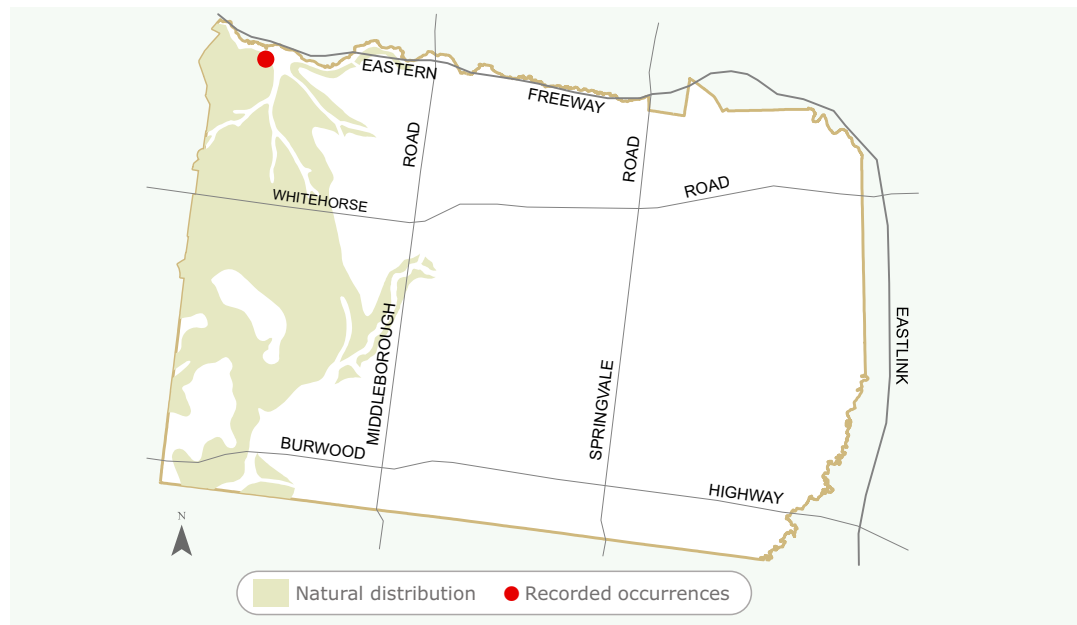
