



Eucalyptus cephalocarpa

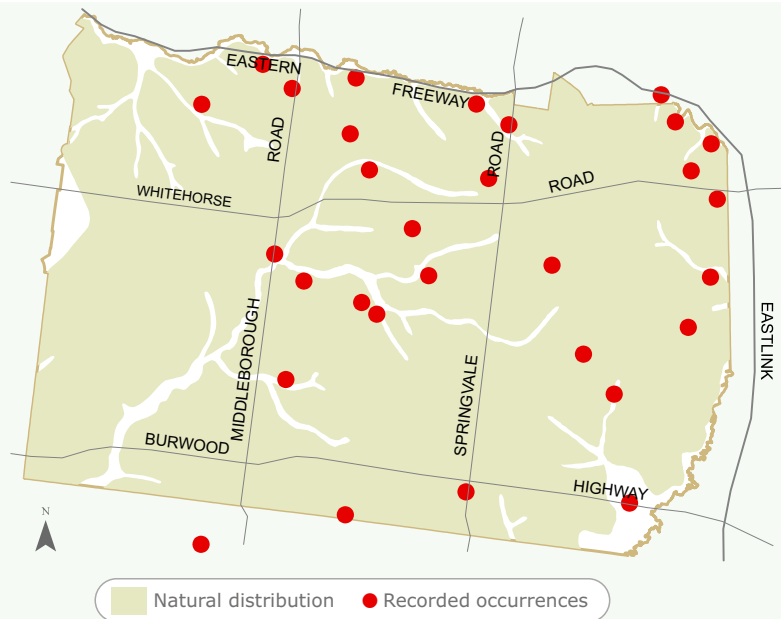
Silver Leafed Stringybark, Mealy Stringybark

Height:	8m - 20m
Width:	5m - 15m
Habit:	A medium sized tree with a dense canopy. Rough, fibrous bark is persistent throughout.
Foliage:	Juvenile leaves - silver, round to egg-shaped up to 11cm x 6cm. Adult leaves - grey-green, oblong up to 20cm x 2.5cm.
Flowers:	Clusters of silvery, shiny diamond-shaped buds followed by profuse white to cream flowers. Silvery flat topped bell-shaped fruit. Flowers from March to August.
Requirements:	Adaptable to a wide range of soils, tolerating periods of inundation and limited periods of dryness. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Useful as a shade or shelter tree. Can resist moderate to light frosts.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is high.
