



# *Eucalyptus radiata*

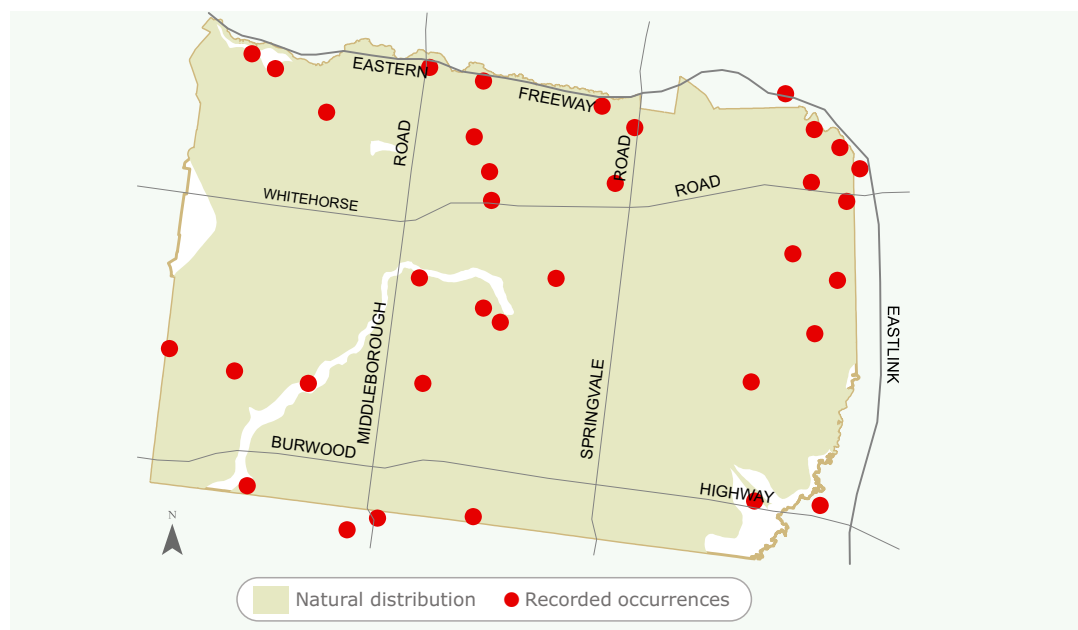
## Narrow-leaved Peppermint

<b>Height:</b>	10m - 20m
<b>Width:</b>	6m - 15m
<b>Habit:</b>	A medium to tall low-branching tree with semi-pendulous branches and a dense and compact crown. Straight unbranched trunk with grey-brown fibrous bark throughout with smaller branches becoming smooth.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Juvenile leaves - soft and broad-shaped with pointed tips to 15cm x 3.5cm. Adult leaves - dull grey-green, thin and narrow to 15cm x 2cm. Leaves have a strong peppermint aroma when crushed.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Clusters of club-shaped buds followed by profuse white to cream flowers from October to January. Cup shaped fruit with a pointed tip.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Well drained soils, tolerating a range of conditions. Full or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	An attractive and graceful tree providing shade and shelter. The Narrow-leaved Peppermint is one of the best species for producing high grade eucalyptus oil.

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is high.
