



Eucalyptus yarraensis

Yarra Gum

Height:	10m - 20m
Width:	5m - 10m
Habit:	Small to medium tree with a short trunk and dense spreading canopy. Rough brown to black fibrous bark persists on the trunk and sometimes on large branches.
Foliage:	Juvenile leaves - dull green and oval shaped to 5-8cm x 3-5cm. Adult leaves - glossy green, elliptic or broad lance-shaped to 6-10cm x 3-5cm.
Flowers:	Clusters of 7 small diamond-shaped buds. White flowers in January, followed by small round to elliptic shaped fruit.
Requirements:	Tolerates heavy soils and limited inundation. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	A good windbreak or shade tree. The Yarra Gum is endemic to Victoria and is listed as rare.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is rare.

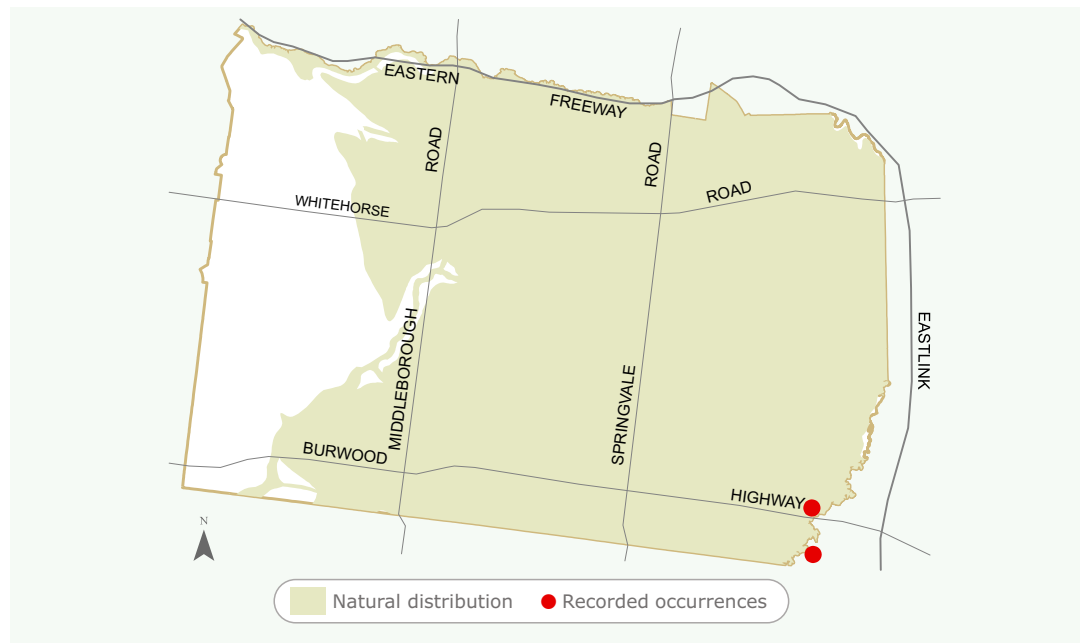
