| Height: | 1m - 3m |
| Width: | 1m - 2m |
| Habit: | Rigid upright shrub. |
| Foliage: | Stiff, flattened, narrow, sharp pointed leaves to 20cm long. |
| Flowers: | Short clusters of small white to cream flowers from July to November followed by brown, woody and broadly cone-shaped fruit to 2cm long with a short beak. |
| Requirements: | Adaptable, well drained soils. Full or partial sun. |
| Cultivation & uses: | An attractive hardy plant providing an interesting landscape feature as a narrow erect form or planted as a group. Useful as a screening plant, prune to maintain a bushy habit. Provides a safe retreat for small birds. |

Local Distribution:

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.

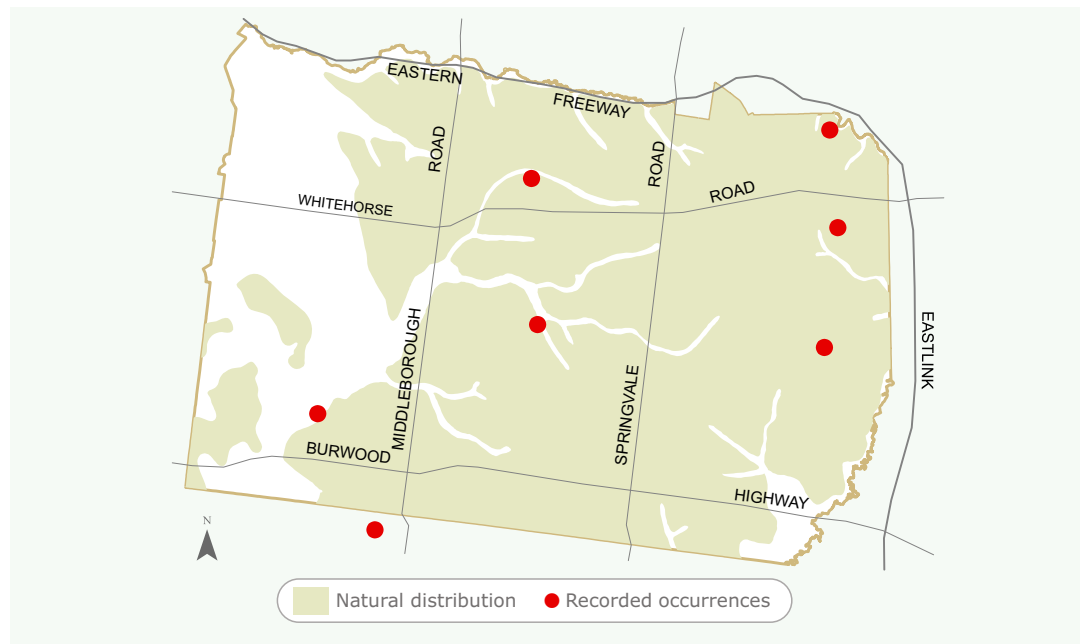
