



Hibbertia stricta

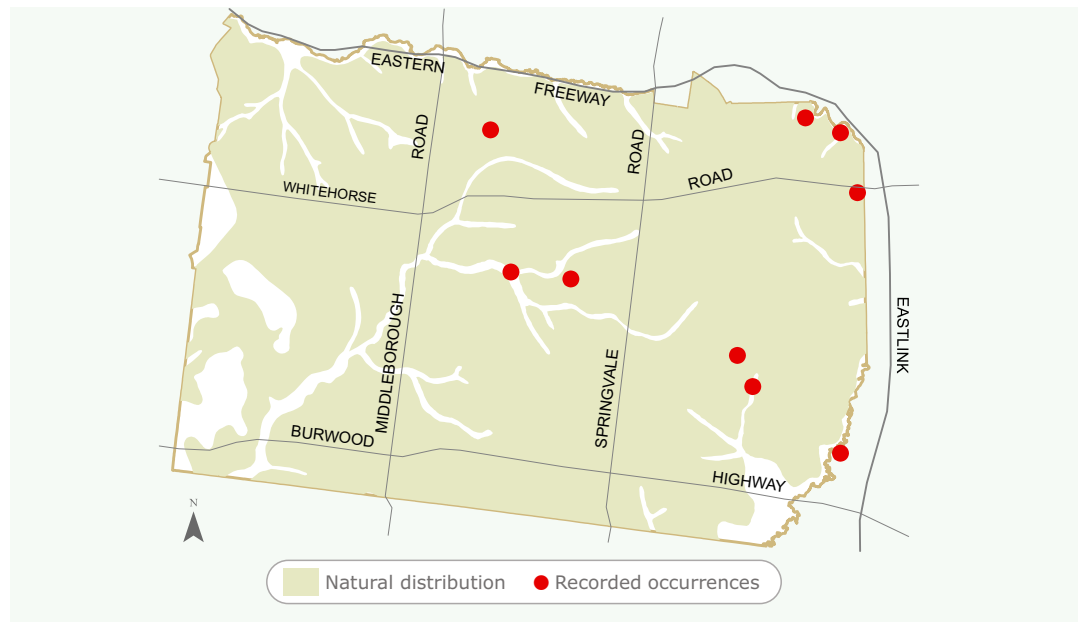
Erect Guinea-flower

Height:	0.4m - 1m
Width:	0.3m - 1m
Habit:	A small, showy rounded to erect shrub.
Foliage:	Narrow dull grey-green leaves to 12mm long.
Flowers:	Yellow flowers from August to November, though flowering may occur at any time throughout the year.
Requirements:	Moist, well drained soils. Shade, full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	An attractive plant for rockeries, containers and cottage gardens. Tolerates drought once established.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.
