



Juncus flavidus

Yellow Rush

Height:	0.4m - 1.2m
Width:	0.2m - 1m
Habit:	Tufted perennial rush spreading from underground stems.
Foliage:	Yellow to green stems with dark brown-reddish sheath-like leaves towards the base.
Flowers:	Pale yellow flowers clustered along stems, become bright yellow as they mature. Flowers from November to May.
Requirements:	Prefers moist soils but tolerates dryer soils through Summer. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Useful for around wet areas such as ponds. Bird and insect attracting.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is moderate.

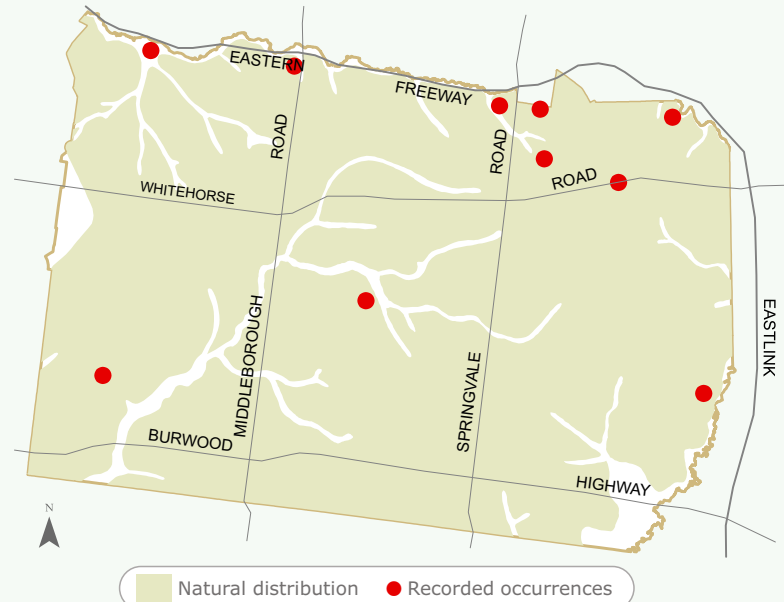
