



Juncus pauciflorus

Loose-flower Rush

Height:	0.3m - 1m
Width:	20cm - 60cm
Habit:	Tufted perennial rush spreading from underground stems, forming a bright green often arching clump.
Foliage:	Bright green stems with tight dark reddish-brown sheath-like leaves towards the base.
Flowers:	Clusters of open to loose reddish flowers on drooping branchlets. Flowers from December to March.
Requirements:	Adaptable, prefers moist soils, tolerating dryness once established. Partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	A delicate rush for damp gardens and beside water areas such as ponds.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.

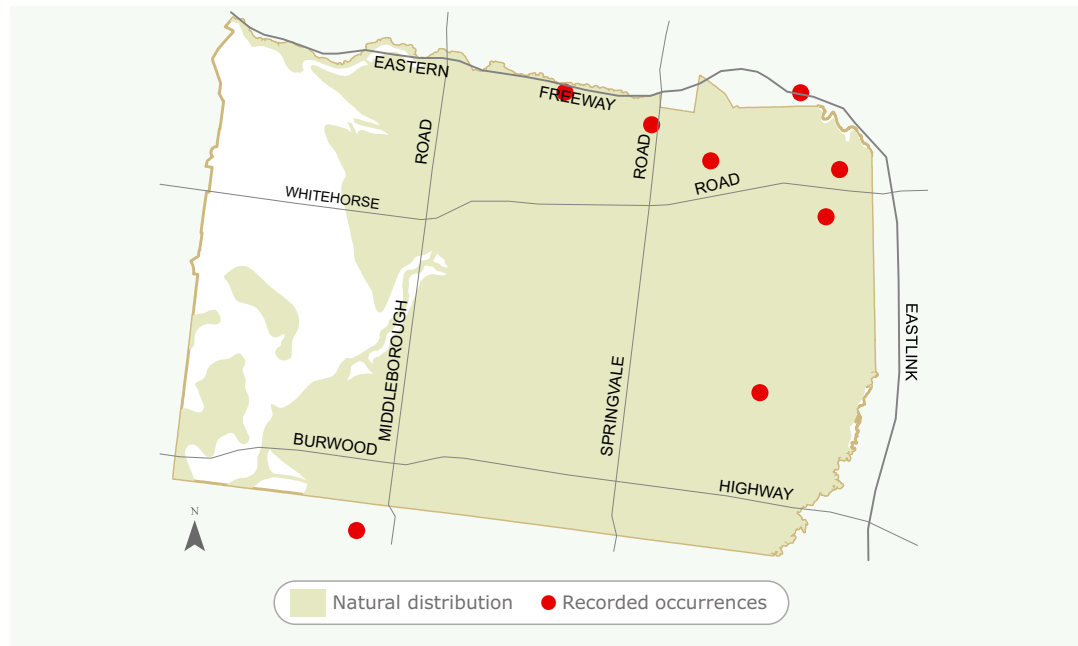
