



# *Juncus subsecundus*

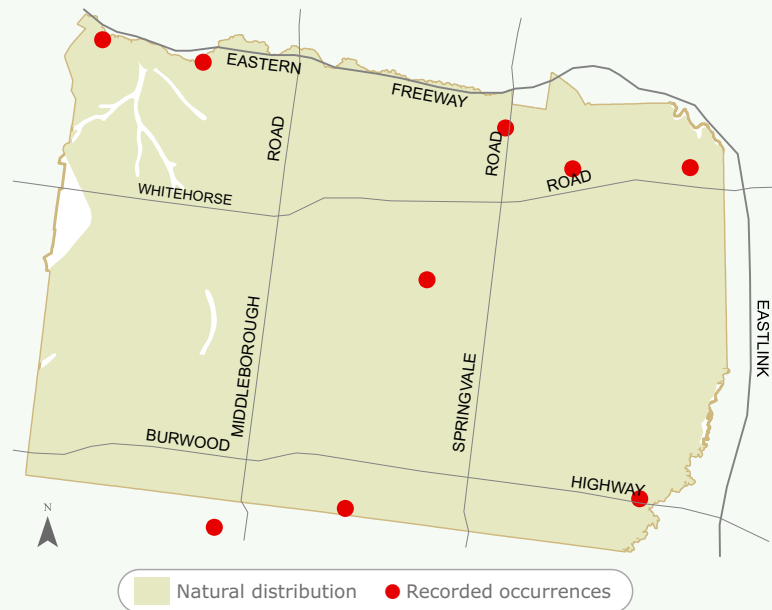
## Finger Rush

<b>Height:</b>	0.5m - 1m
<b>Width:</b>	0.5m - 1m
<b>Habit:</b>	Tufted perennial rush spreading from underground stems.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Smooth, slender, dull blue-green stems with tufted pale to mid brown sheath-like leaves to 12cm long at the base of stems.
<b>Flowers:</b>	Clusters of pale brown flowerheads on branches along one side of the stem. Flowers from November to January, March to May.
<b>Requirements:</b>	Adaptable, preferring moist soils, tolerating short periods of dryness. Full or partial sun.
<b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b>	An attractive rush, that may form large colonies in heavy, wet soils. Suited to moist areas of the garden and near edges of water.

### Local Distribution:

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.
