



Leptorhynchos squamatus

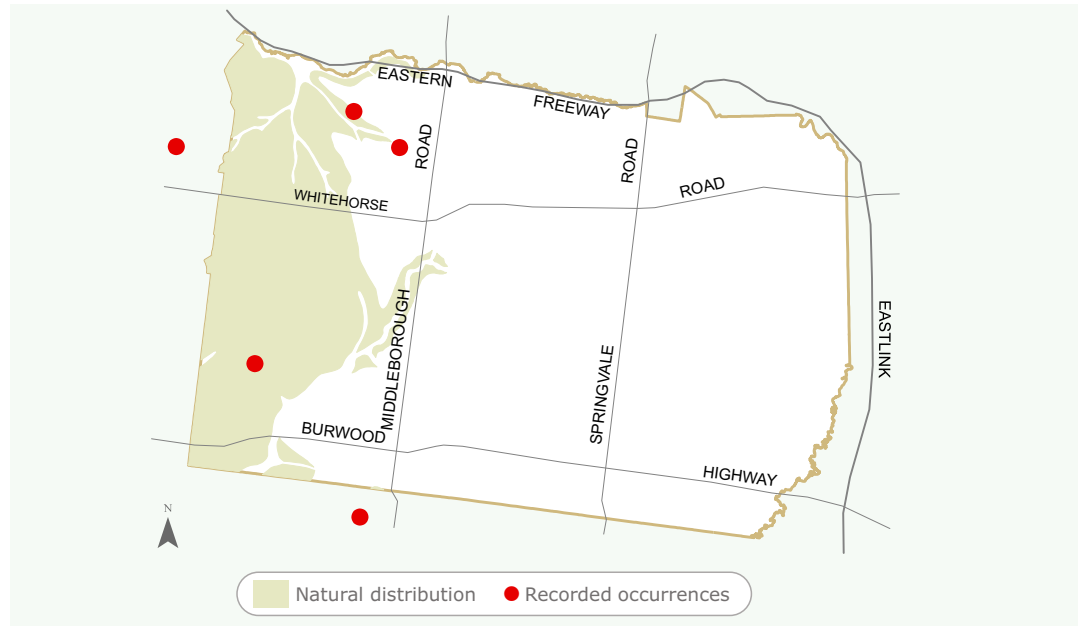
Scaly Buttons

Height:	15cm - 30cm
Width:	40cm
Habit:	Low spreading perennial herb.
Foliage:	Narrow, oblong deep green leaves to 2cm long.
Flowers:	Small yellow button flowerheads on long, scaly, slender stems held high above the foliage. Flowers from September to January
Requirements:	Moist, well drained soils. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	Excellent showy plant for rockery gardens and cottage gardens. Summer watering is beneficial. Frost tolerant.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.
