| Height: | 10cm - 30cm |
| Width: | 30cm |
| Habit: | Upright, branching wiry perennial herb. |
| Foliage: | Very narrow, deep green pointy leaves with white hairs on the undersurface. |
| Flowers: | Yellow button flowerheads to 10mm wide, held erect on wiry stems. Flowers from September to January. |
| Requirements: | Well drained soils. Full or partial sun. |
| Cultivation & uses: | An attractive, showy groundcover, suitable for rockery, cottage gardens or for growing in containers. |

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.

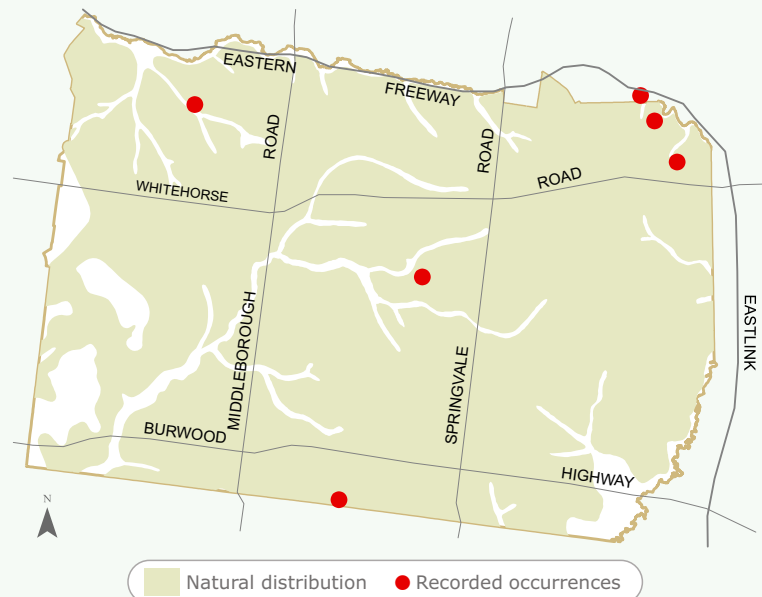
