



Lycopus australis

Australian Gypsywort

Height:	To 1m
Width:	Spreading
Habit:	Leafy, erect, slightly branched herb rooting along underground stems.
Foliage:	Pairs of aromatic, oval to lance-shaped lime-green leaves with jagged edges to 10cm.
Flowers:	Dense clusters of tiny white petalled flowers arranged around the stem at the base of leaves. Flowers from December to April.
Requirements:	Moist to wet soils. Shade or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	An interesting foliage plant for damp areas, ponds and creek edges.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is rare.

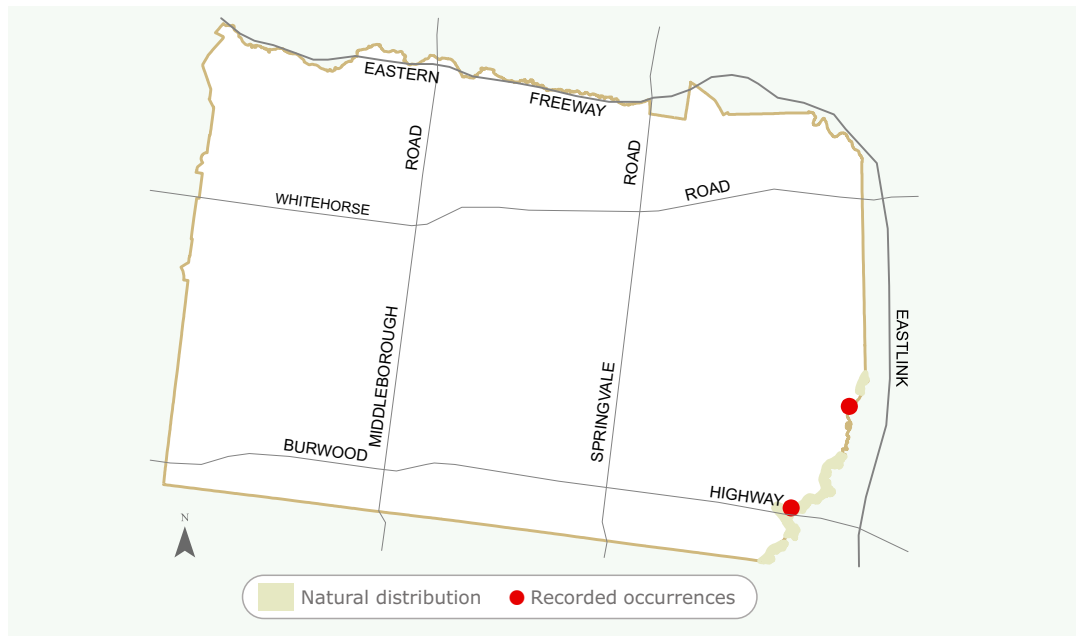
