



Microseris lanceolata

Yam Daisy, Native Dandelion

Height:	Prostrate, stems to 50cm
Width:	15cm - 25cm
Habit:	Small tufted perennial herb.
Foliage:	Tufts of dark-green, shiny, long narrow toothed leaves to 20cm long.
Flowers:	Single bright yellow daisy flowerheads to 2-3cm in diameter on a erect stems from July to November, followed by fluffy white heads.
Requirements:	Well drained soils. Full to partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	The Yam daisy differs from the introduced dandelion by its narrow leaves and drooping flower buds. Useful for containers, rockeries or cottage gardens. Regenerates annually from tuberous rootstock.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is rare.

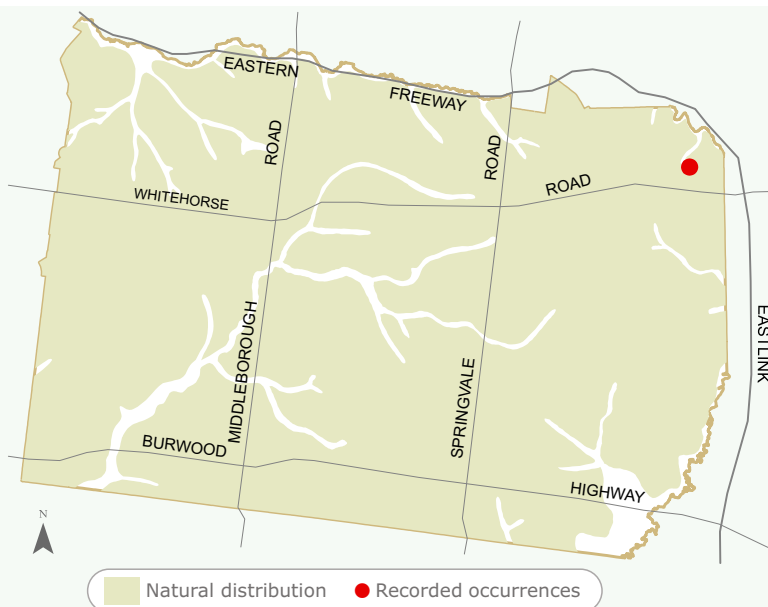
