

Platylobium obtusangulum

Common Flat-pea

Height:

0.6m - 1m

Width:

1m

Habit:

A small wiry upright or trailing shrub.

Foliage:

Triangular or arrow-shaped leaves to 3cm long with sharp tips.

Flowers:

Large yellow pea flowers with red centres on short stalks hidden by papery bracts.

Flowers from September to December.

Requirements:

Well drained soils, preferring drier sites. Full or partial sun.

Cultivation & uses:

A useful plant for shady areas where it will scramble through other plants.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is high.
