



# *Pomaderris aspera*

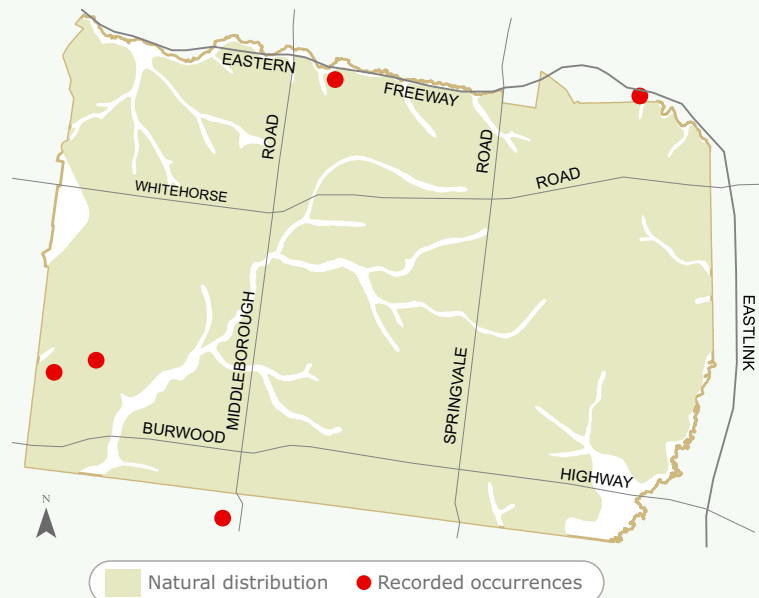
## Hazel Pomaderris

| <b>Height:</b>                 | 3m - 6m  |
| <b>Width:</b>                  | 2m - 4m  |
| <b>Habit:</b>                  | Slender leafy shrub or small tree.   |
| <b>Foliage:</b>                | Dark green large soft leaves to 14cm long, paler on the underside.   |
| <b>Flowers:</b>                | Masses of cream-yellow flowers from October to December. Petals absent.  |
| <b>Requirements:</b>           | Well drained soil. Adaptable, preferring moist sites. Shade or partial sun.  |
| <b>Cultivation &amp; uses:</b> | May be established beneath existing trees and suited as a tall screen or windbreak. Useful for stabilising soils along streams and gullies. The tree has interesting bark markings as it ages. |

### Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.
