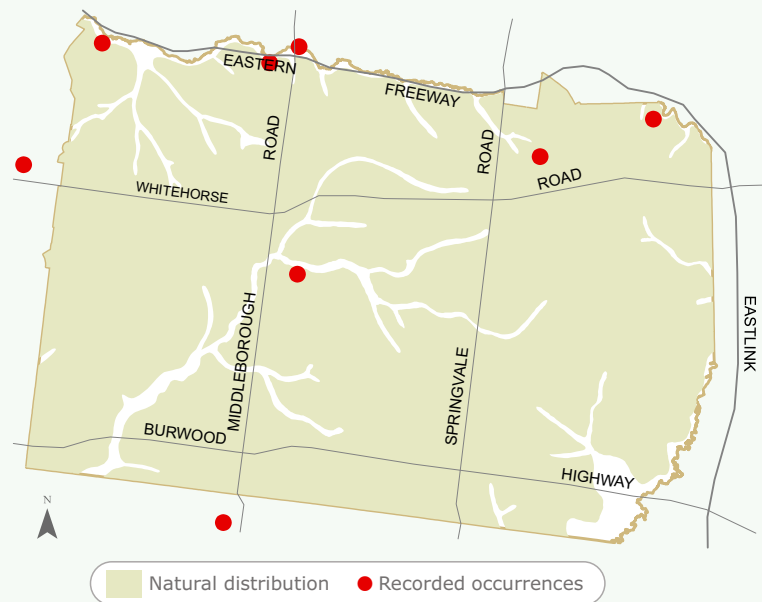
Large Kangaroo Apple

| Height: | 1m - 3m |
| Width: | 1m - 3m |
| Habit: | A fast-growing, open, erect, medium shrub. |
| Foliage: | Rich dark green narrow leaves, lighter green beneath, to 30cm long. |
| Flowers: | Blue to purple flowers to 5cm wide with bright yellow anthers. Flowers from September to March. Egg-shaped fruit turns yellow-orange when ripe. |
| Requirements: | Well drained soils, tolerant of most conditions. Shade, full or partial sun. |
| Cultivation & uses: | A hardy decorative shrub, suited as a small screen or for bank and erosion stabilisation. A coloniser of cleared or disturbed areas. Generally short-lived in cultivation. Prune to encourage a denser habit. |

Local Distribution:

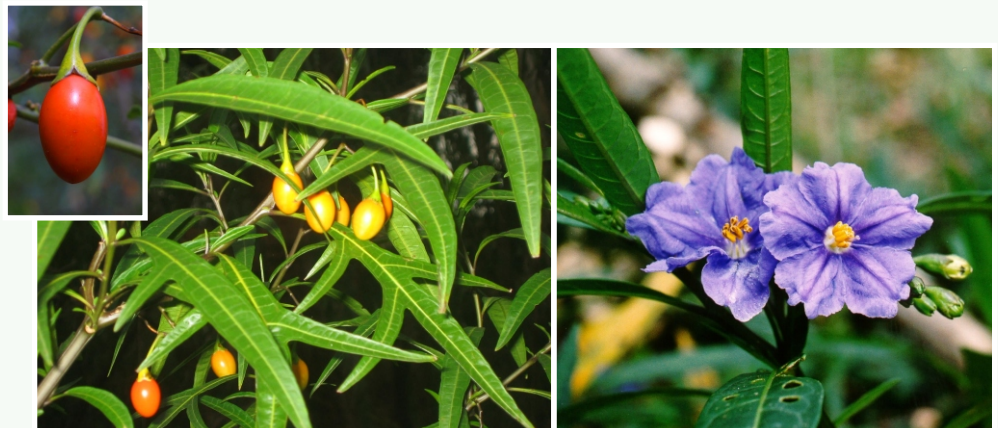
Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.
