



Spyridium parvifolium

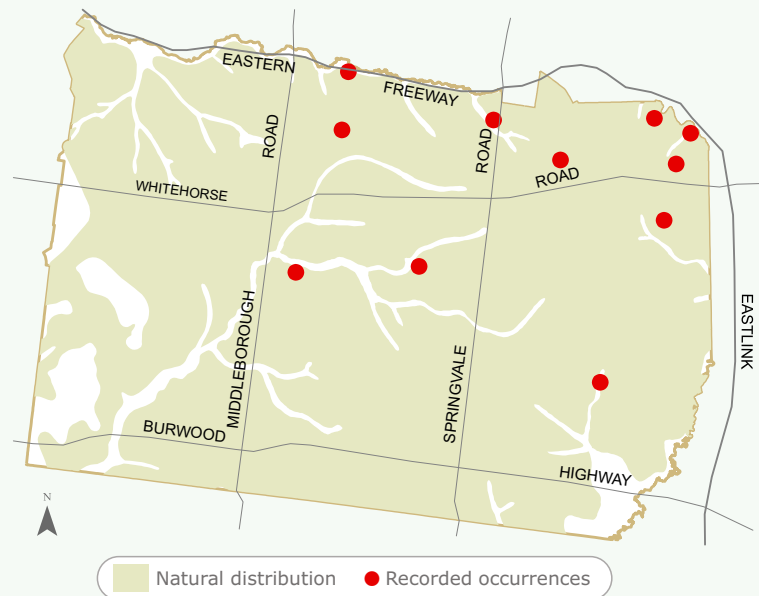
Australian Dusty Miller

Height:	1m - 3m
Width:	1m - 2m
Habit:	Small to medium dense upright shrub.
Foliage:	Dark green oval leaves to 25mm long with notched ends and pale green beneath. Stems are hairy and rusty in colour.
Flowers:	Small white honey-scented flowers in flat clusters surrounded by dusty-white floral leaves. Flowers from July to November.
Requirements:	Well drained soils, tolerating dryness once established. Shade or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	An attractive shrub providing a light screen and to brighten dry and shady areas.

Local Distribution:

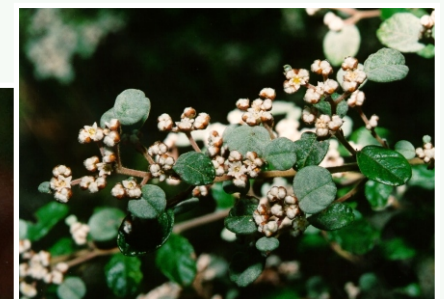
Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.
