



Wahlenbergia stricta

Tall Bluebell

Height:	40cm - 90cm
Width:	30cm - 40cm
Habit:	Erect clumping much-branched perennial herb.
Foliage:	Oblong leaves 1-7cm long with wavy edges.
Flowers:	Light blue or occasionally white flowers in the form of open bells to 25mm wide, on erect slender stems. Flowers from August to January.
Requirements:	Well drained soils, tolerating some dryness. Full or partial sun.
Cultivation & uses:	These grass-like plants are ideal for mass display or as drifts, in cottage gardens or under trees. Plants die back to underground rootstock during long periods of dryness.

Local Distribution:

Map is indicative to the natural distribution of the species based on the best available knowledge.

The natural occurrence of this species is infrequent.

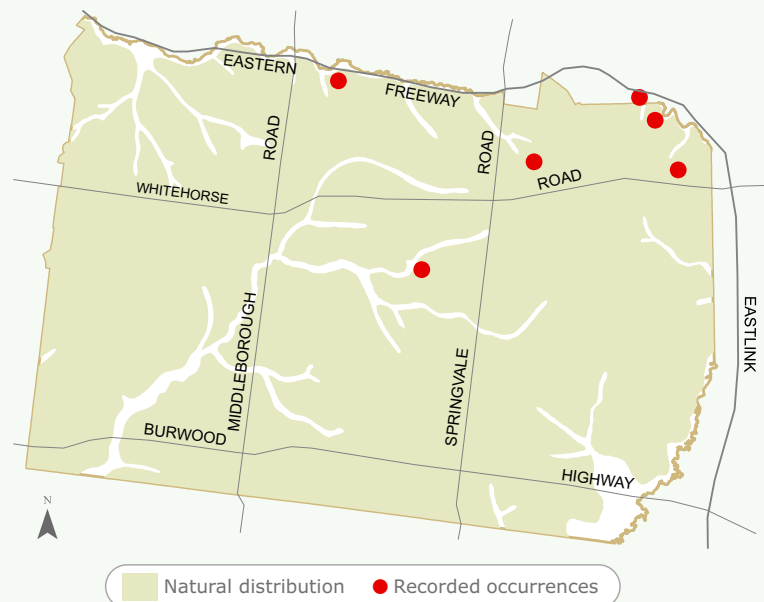
